Dear Dr. Hurlburt:


Thank you for your good and informative letter of the 11th which arrived here yesterday. I am familiar with the installations at Penticton and the rocket work at Michigan. The proposed array at Penn State sounds interesting but rather peripheral to my ideas. Apparently you saw nothing vaguely similar building or proposed in Europe.

My results here have been so far beyond expectations that it seems important to have a look at the outer parts of the Milkyway and the north galactic pole for comparative purposes. I plan to return to U.S.A. early next year and follow this matter up as rapidly as possible. If you wish, I hereby sort of stake a claim on these kind of investigations. In the mean time, please keep me advised of anything pertinent which develops.

From this distance I have difficulty following the flow of personnel. Last I heard of Swenson, he was at Illinois and Findlay was at Arecibo.

A few days ago I sent a prompting note to Haworth. Please disregard, if it filters down to you.
