Admission of Senior and Entrance Scholars

You are requested to meet the Master in the Ante-Chapel at 2 p.m. on Friday next, 14th October, for the Admission of Scholars.

Academic dress must be worn as follows:-

Dark suit, black boots or shoes, white collar,
white bow-tie, white bands (which can be hired
from any University Tailor) and gown.

HOLDERS OF DEGREES WHO MAY BE ADMITTED AS SENIOR SCHOLARS SHOULD WEAR
their appropriate academic dress with hood.

The Senior Scholars are admitted first. They file into the Chapel (in alphabetical order) and then each scholar (a) reads a short declaration from the College Statutes, (b) signs the Admissions Book, (c) kneels before the Master and places his hands between the hands of the Master who formally admits him in Latin, (d) returns to the Ante-Chapel.

Full Christian names are required both in the declaration and the signature. Pens are provided, but you may find it more convenient to use your own (preferably not ball point).

When all the Senior Scholars have been admitted they file into the Chapel once more and the Master reads their names from the Admissions Book (hence the need for legible signatures). This completes the Admission of Senior Scholars.

Then follows the Admission of Entrance Scholars, which is similar to the Admission of Senior Scholars.
