Gentlemen:

By air parcel post I am sending a carton containing ten samples of charcoal. They are labeled and have quantity as follows.

Sample	2C	3A	4A	5A	6B	7C	9A	10A	11A	12A
Grams	3.0	1.4	3.8	5.0	1.0	5.4	1.5	6.6	8.1	9.2

Most samples are fairly free from organic material. However, all contain fine bits of sand and perhaps a few pebbles of stone. I trust that you will be able to remove the extraneous material before an analysis is made.

Three samples are near your lower limit of quantity. It seems unwise to mix material from a second digging with the material on hand, merely to increase the quantity. If these provide interesting results; it will be possible to secure a larger sample of material at a later date for a more precise analysis.
