Dear Dr. Reber.

Thanks for your letter of 9th. September. I have received the additional sample material that you sent (7B, 13B, 13C).

I was most interested in the details of the five I- dates. There's little doubt that the lab. was in trouble at the time.

I didn't realize that you had had some duplicates done already; I don't think anything more need be done before concluding that those I- dates are up the pole. 2E and 9B seem to be clear contradictions; 10A tends to reinforce this, as you say, and, if my own result for 7B is incompatible with I-320 I'll be satisfied that there's no mystery.

Are these the only modern or more-than-modern figures you've got? I thought there were a couple from Japan and New Zealand. I am interested in these odd results; some people classify them with the great unexplained mysteries of Life, but I think the explanations are easier to find.

What happened about payment for those five? Surely you didn't have to foot the bill!

I am sending back 13C which I won't need, but am hanging on to 7B and 13B, thanks.

Let me know if you have had any more weird ones.
