Thank you for the list of 90-GHz flux densities. I'll get our fluxes for these soon, plus the structures.

Paul and I are submitting a proposal to Algonquin to observe the brighter sources at 22 GHz. On what timescale do you envisage writing this work up? We should have our observing in April/May.

The galaxy-theory paper (Henriksen and Reinhardt) is now being typed, so we should be able to send preprints soon. The NGC 315 and Abell 2256 papers are also nearly finished, but things go very slowly during term. Expect an outburst of verbage from us in the near future!
