I pointed out to him ~~this~~ that it only had an antique value and was of no value as a piece of telephonic apparatus, as it couldn't possibly be used in a communication network. He says the customs office only recognizes antique value on items made before 1830! I asked him if setting a value for insurance would establish a value for customs duty and he said not necessarily. If you possibly insured it for \$75⁰⁰ it would have too much duty.
