

RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved*, That the National Science Foundation is re-
2 quested to formulate and transmit to the Congress at the
3 earliest practicable date its recommendations for such changes
4 in—

5 (1) the laws under which research and develop-
6 ment funds are granted, loaned, or otherwise made avail-
7 able by departments or agencies of the Government to
8 institutions of higher learning for scientific or educa-
9 tional purposes; or

10 (2) the administration of such laws;
11 as may be necessary and desirable to provide for a more
12 equitable distribution of such funds to all qualified institu-

- 1 tions of higher learning to avoid the concentration of such
- 2 activities in any geographical area and to insure a continuing
- 3 reservoir of scientific and teaching skills and capacities
- 4 throughout the several States.
