Dear Dr. Reber:

I have taken this address from the February, 1965, list of members of the American Astronomical Society, and hope it is correct.

In 1961, we published a photo of your first radio telescope in Wheaton, Illinois, in a textbook called MODERN SPACE SCIENCE, which was written for a high school course in astronomy. My co-author was Frederick E. Trinklein, at that time living in Racine, Wisconsin, and now in Long Island.

Now we are engaged in writing an elementary textbook for the first course in college astronomy to be called INTRODUCTORY ASTRONOMY. The authors are Huffer, Trinklein, and Bunge. In this book we should like to republish the original photo from MODERN SPACE SCIENCE, in the interest of the history of radio astronomy. This text will be about 480 pages in length, will be published by Holt, Rinehart, and Winston, copyright about 1967, and will sell for approximately seven dollars.

I am writing today for your permission to re-publish. We have the half-tone from the first book and need only your permission to publish.

I should also like to have a tracing of a scan over a radio source and thought you might have a suitable one - also with permission to publish. We shall give full credit to the source. If you wish to specify the exact wording of the credit, please do so in your reply. If there is a fee for permission, please include permission for world rights, and send the bill to me at the above address.
