Dear Charles:

This letter is in reply to yours of the 4th of August. Your description of atmospheric at Wahiawa is most interesting including the account of the angry residents who thought the disturbance was caused by KHK. The phenomenon is rather frequent in Tasmania. They have the British system of government operated broadcasting. When the precipitation static is bad in rural areas, the government is roundly cursed for providing such poor service all drowned out by "ohop frying noise"!

My operations here are completed for the time being at least and I'll be leaving for the mainland in a couple of weeks. Presently I'm getting my affairs in order and cleaning up around Kole Kole. Only a couple of small boxes of personal tools, clothing, etc. are being shipped. Everything else is being stored in the concrete block house. I will continue to assume the rent and taxes. I suggest that NRC pay them and then send me a bill which I will cover promptly. After about the middle of October my address will be for one year,
