The stalks were treated by strong systemic insecticides and fungicides to prevent entry of undesirable pests. Even so, thirteen out of sixteen sprouted. Ten of these are going well. I am informed this is a good percentage. They will be called Palatine variety. It is place in Illinois I mailed the first packet. Please pass on the good word with thanks to Norwegian whose name I cannot remember.

The ionosphere remained opaque at 1155 KC all winter, so observations of cosmic static were a failure.
