(It was comforting to the instructor to know what the correct answer was while they were working on it, too.) The students also thought the project was excessively time-consuming (also of course) and have also stated that they now hate AIPS even worse than they already hated IRAF, despite my efforts to try to explain, as they were going along, how difficult it is to write software that does all that. (Such are students.) They availed themselves frequently of Mark's advice during their reduction, rather more than I had intended that they do, and they only did one round of MEM, but they still learned plenty from the experience. They have also concluded that Bridle and Swain are godlike practicioners of interferometry to produce the final images I kept showing them to keep them inspired. Thanks a lot for lending us the data. (Let me know if you'd like to see what their final images looked like - but it may serve the purpose simply to note that they weren't as good as the ones in Mark's thesis, and the biggest deficiency left is the "bowl" caused by their insufficient attention to the short-spacing extrapolation.)
