
The spring meetings were extremely lively and interesting. Among the group from overseas were Messrs. Ryle and Vandehulst.

As you know, Leif Owren is with us for solar interferometer observations and F.G. Smith has just arrived to take an active part in our radio astronomy work, probably with emphasis on the question of radio star scintillations. We expect that Smith will be with us for a year longer.

I am pleased to note your progress in the analyses of F scatter from ionospheric records at Kiehi and will be looking forward to the receipt of your figures.
